





I cannot convey the gratitude my heart feels regarding your CHIES donation to the Timothy Warren NRESci Memorial Scholarship. This year, my friends, you donated \$245.00!! Although my heart is so broken, it does give me great comfort knowing that I work with so many people that give of themselves to remember my son and in turn, support the youth in this wonderful 4H Program!

Timothy's 20th birthday would have been Sunday, April 26th. I always share a story about him on his birthday and I thought I would share that with you all as well. It might give you an insight on what a wonderful person he was and it might let you know how your contributions to his scholarship brought me joy on this very hard day.

When our boys were little, they loved for us to tell them real life “stories” about their childhood. We always began our stories like this, “Once upon a time there was a little boy named” and then insert the name of whichever one we were telling the story about. So, in honor of Tim’s birthday, I’ll share one of those stories with you today:

Once upon a time, there was a little boy named Timothy. Timothy was a lover of nature from the time he was able to walk and explore on his own. He loved playing with worms, catching ring neck snakes, skinny little green snakes, grasshoppers, frogs, and especially toads.

One evening he had been collecting toads in a bucket and he had about five or six in there along with some leaves, sticks, dirt and worms. He had been playing with them, trying to feed them, and could occasionally be heard talking to them. However, he was always ever so gentle with them.

This was not an uncommon thing for Tim, because he would catch them, play with them a while and then put them back in their “homes” around our property. They must not have cared, as they never left. Even when we moved from our first home to our second home, all the toads that lived around our house, made the move with us.

However, this one particular evening, it was balmy hot outside and after several hours of playing with them, Bob came down the steps, from the porch, to find Timothy crying. Bob asked him what on earth was wrong? Through tears, Tim looked up at his Dad and lifted the bucket to show him that the toads were all dead. Tim just sat there, sweat beading up on his brow, shaky little chubby fingers, and tears just streaming down his face making tracks from his eyes to his cheeks in the dust that had collected on his face from playing all day. Bob asked him, “What on earth happened to your toads Tim?” He looked at his dad and said, “Daddy, bugs were bothering them, so I sprayed them with our bug spray.”

He was so devastated over those toads, he never quite got over it and talked about it for many years. It hurt him so bad. From then on, for as long as I can remember, if we saw a frog or turtle in the road, Tim would make me stop and he would get out and move it to the side of the road so it would not get run over by a car. I think he somehow wanted to make amends for what had happened that one evening.

One of the last videos we have of Timothy, he and Andrew were catching frogs in the little branch that runs in front of our house. They were studying frog eggs and were able to actually capture on video the frogs expanding and contracting to make their summer sounds. In the video, Timothy can be heard telling Andrew to “be careful” as he picked up the frogs.

What I wouldn’t give to have that toad-catching boy back here. His absence is deafening at times. But, there are times, late at night when I sit outside and hear the frogs singing, that I think they miss him too and are actually calling his name.....
